Message from the First Lady Sis. Ellen P. Barney







NABCOR's Women's Ministry Fall Classes

LEAD I

This course explores the nature of spirituality (spiritual theology) and its influence on spiritual friendships and discipleship (spiritual formation through soul care and spiritual direction). It will entail equipping sisters to develop spiritual friendships to biblical truths so that relational maturity within the Body of Christ may be obtained. Also incorporated in this course is a basic theology of relationships as originally designed by God (biblical anthropology-understanding man's creation), as distorted by sin (biblical Hamartiology-understanding man's sinfulness), and as redeemed by Christ (biblical soteriology-understanding Christ's redemptive plan). Students are encouraged to develop spiritual friendships that incorporate biblical truths that embrace God's love for hurting individuals by implementing a fundamental historic Christian model of soul care (sustaining/healing) and spiritual direction (reconciling/guiding).

LEAD III

In the context of a nurturing community, students will discover how to apply spiritual theology to personal ministry. Students will learn how to think biblically (analysis through biblical wisdom), relate deeply (treatment through care), and communicate skillfully (intervention through interaction) as spiritual friends. Interpersonal interaction and dynamics, reading, lecture, role-play, evaluation of live lay encouragement, and observation will be used to facilitate personal growth.
