Worry consumed her — the kids, the bills, talk of layoffs at work. Her stomach churned, and the ache across her shoulders never seemed to go away. She knew she should trust the Lord with the challenges that shadowed her life right now, but it was so hard...so overwhelming. It was just devouring her.

Whenever we find ourselves eaten up with worry, fear, anxiety, or devoured by the pressures of the day, God tells us to take note. Being consumed is a red flag, and God gives us directions for just such times.

"Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you. Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith" (1 Peter 5:7, NIV).

There is an enemy of our souls and his goal is to devour us. God tells us to be alert. Take note when you are being consumed by something. Scripture tells us the enemy of our soul comes to kill, steal, and destroy, and we are to be watchful. Being consumed by fear, worry, gossip, a particular temp-

tation or the pressures of the day will, at best, steal from you and rob you of peace in your soul and joy in the moment. At worst, it can destroy health and relationships and your fellowship with the God who wants to help you.

So what do you do when vou realize something is just eating you up? You resist as the scripture says. How do you resist? You begin to see worry as a call to prayer, inviting God into your circumstance to direct you and give you wisdom. You resist worry through prayer (Phil. 4:6). You resist fear through Scripture, knowing God has said that He has not given us the spirit of fear (2 Tim. 1:7). You stand firm in your faith, knowing that the consuming downward spiral you find yourself in is not your Heavenly Father's plan for you.

and burdens in a written prayer to God. Release them from your heart and mind.

Pray it in...

Ask God to take the things on your list and to give you His peace in return. Be prepared to ask for His strength to resist your worries each time they threaten to overwhelm you. Exchange your worries, in prayer, for God's peace.

Work it out...



Choose this response in the face of anxiety. Use worry as a call to prayer. God will enable you to face the challenge without being consumed by it. Run to Him today.

Do you believe God cares about you? Write a note to God, thanking Him for His love and care for you. Your worry is a call to prayer. List the things that

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tend to devour you. Write out your fears, concerns,

Stressed from my job, health concerns, family concerns, and questions on where God is leading me during this season of my life, I went into my closet to find answers. It started out as a pity party for me, but my prayers turned into a revelation and confirmation of who Jesus is and has been to me through it all.

Psalm 23 has been imbedded in my memory since childhood Sunday School, yet I didn't REALLY ponder on the significance and meaning of the verses that I knew by memory so well. While staying in prayer over these things and asking the Lord for help, I specifically asked that He work out every situation for the positive. With my earthly battery running low with responsibilities and obligations, I know I needed a supernatural re-charge, because I even started missing my dates with my Best Friend that I so cherished.

Psalm 23 would creep into my prayer while I asked for help with this or that. I thought I was saying Psalm 23 automatically out of honor to the Lord as part of my acknowledgement of who He is. It just so happened that --(come on-you know the truth—I should change my sentence to..."it was planned that") I came across a required reading from a prior class taken at NABCOR a year or two ago called God's Woman. What caught my eye on the cover were the words "12 Life -Changing Truths From Psalm 23." The name of the book was "Powerful Promises for

Every Woman" by Elizabeth George.

As I reviewed the 12 Truths the author listed, I paused and reflected on Psalm 23. I had my answers—just keep trusting in Him. Examples were just popping into my head from prior trials and victories we've won. I just hadn't seen the words like I saw them so clearly that night. I wasn't just reciting from memorization, the Holy Spirit was giving me "The Answer" to every problem. We know firsthand of God's faithfulness and are exposed to the person and character of God in our daily walk with Him.

If you are going through a tough spot or maybe haven't REALLY examined the meaning behind the verses of the 23rd Psalm that disclose Jesus as your "loving shepherd" (Jehovah-Rohi) through every twist and turn in life, before you were saved and now a believer in Christ, take some time to do so now. Wherever you are in your spiritual maturity, grab a hold and claim His promises! Elizabeth George identifies these 12 Promises in Psalm

- **1.** God's Promise of Care -The Lord is my shepherd (v. 1),
- 2. God's Promise of Provision I shall not want (for anything) (v. 1),
- **3.** God's Promise of Rest He makes me to lie down in green pastures (v. 2).
- **4.** God's Promise of Peace He leads me beside the still waters (v. 2)
- 5. God's Promise of Healing -

He restores my soul (v. 3),

- **6.** God's Promise of Guidance He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake (v. 3).
- 7. God's Promise of Presence -Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me (v. 4),
- **8.** God's Promise of Comfort I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me (v.4),
- 9. God's Promise of Friendship -You prepare a table before me... You anoint my head with oil; my cup runs over (privileged and abundantly blessed) (v.5),
- **10.** God's Promise of Protection -...in the presence of my enemies (v.5),
- **11.** God's Promise of Hope Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life (v.6),
- **12.** God's Promise of Home And I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever (v.6).

Have you considered the promises of God? I challenge you to consider God's Word and apply it to your life.
There is wealth in the Word of God. Try getting rich!

In the past several months, I have noticed that my little


girl is beginning to participate

Though unworthy we are, still your friends we are called.


Even now, you still love us all!

You Can't Hurry God...You Just Have to Wait!

Psalm 130:5 - I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in His Word I put my hope.

Ever wonder why things don't seem to go your way? Maybe you are in need of a new car. Maybe the mortgage is late, and payment is not in sight. Maybe the children are wayward, and you are praying for them to straighten out. Maybe you are having a hard time at work, and you wonder when the load will get lighter. Maybe you are in a relationship that is dead, and you are wondering will you die in it. Maybe you are abused. Maybe you are an abuser. Maybe... Maybe...Maybe!

Sometimes we find ourselves in situations that seem impossible to bear. Is it possible that we entered into these situations without seeking God's approval? Did you date that person even though you knew they had a history of being unfaithful? Did you spend unnecessary money on entertainment or material items? Did you curse in the presence of your children or fight in their presence? Have you been insubordinate on your job? Are you not submitting to your spouse? Did you move when God told you to "stand still"?

God has given us free will. And this means, although we may know the will of God and desire to take a different path, He allows us to make choices contrary to that which He has for us. Oftentimes, the difficulty we have waiting on God is that we underestimate the power that God has! We feel that things are not going according to our plans and begin to take matters into our own hands (i.e. we leave a job w/o hearing from God, we date an individual w/o praying for God's guidance as well as moving ahead of God when we know He has not spoken).

An example of two people that did not believe in the power and promises of God is Abraham and Sarah. When God advised Abraham that he would bare a son, Abraham laughed at God (Genesis 17:17) and Sarah laughed at God (Genesis 17:12), because they did not believe in the power of God. Like Abraham and Sarah, we do not believe God for His promises at times. We grow weary and give into the temptations of "Self" Will versus God's Will. When we do not believe in the power of God, we doubt His promises and deprive ourselves of the very things that He holds in the balance for us. God says in His word...You have not because you ask not, and when you ask, you ask with wrong motives (James 4:3). What is your motive for what you are asking? Will you glorify God or will you glorify self?

Sometimes God's delay is not a denial. God has perfect timing, and it is aligned with His perfect will for our lives. We just have to wait. I encourage you today to wait on the Lord (Psalm 27:14), and as you wait on the Lord, be strong! Don't give into the temptations and lusts of the flesh. Be busy in the Lord as you wait for Him to open the doors and usher you into the next chapter. God has already written your life's plan. There is NO eraser needed because God makes No mistakes. Just wait!

Lord, help us to wait on You. Quiet the anxiety in our hearts, and give us peace as we seek Your will. Help us to believe in Your promises and trust in Your Word. In Jesus Name, Amen.
