

man nature is innately sinful (Job 14:4; Jeremiah 17:9; Romans 7:5,17). Therefore, the transformational process of becoming whole is slow. Of course, we would like for the process to be swift, with no suffering.

Nonetheless, for our benefit and for His glory, God transforms us in a timely manner. According to 2 Corinthians 3:18, NIV, we are reminded, "And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit." This particular Scripture

notes that our faces reveal God's everincreasing glory (cf. 4:6). The ongoing reflection is evidence of the Lord's glory, which means that it is eternal. Our eternal reflection of the Lord's glory is accomplished through the ministry of the abiding permanent presence of the Holy Spirit (4:17). And, as we give continual evidence concerning the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22), we are being transformed into the likeness of Christ (1 Corinthians 3:18). Unlike Moses' glory, which was a thinning luminosity (2 Corinthians 4:7, 13), our glory is progressive.

Becoming whole in Christ is simply no easy task. Let's face it — who enjoys change? In spite of this, our transformational process is not stagnant. It must be constant and dynamic. Change demands a willingness to be transformed. Thus, we must

be willing to allow the Spirit of Christ to transform our character, however difficult. Nevertheless, the process must occur, whether by trials, tribulations, suffering, disappointments losses, etc. Voluntarily or involuntarily, we will be changed. Intimate-(adj.) closely acquainted, private, personal, detailed, thorough. (n.) very close friend.

You get closely acquainted with someone by spending quality time with them. This is not achieved by infrequency but by repetition and set aside one-on-one time that you deliberately and intentionally want to share with that person. The intimacy grows as you share, reveal, explore, seek understanding, and allow yourself to be open to love (both giving and receiving).

Intimacy is private because it is an exchange between you and that person, in a place where there are no distractions, and your focus and attention are solely on them. So why not get intimate with

Jesus?

You share all of yourself when you are being intimate. You are open, honest, and detailed about your feelings, thoughts, likes, and dislikes. Be Mature... By Sis. Martha Blizzard

I recently completed a report on what I learned from the book *Be Mature* by Dr. Warren Wiersbe. It is a study on the Book of James.

Be Mature has shown me that it is time for me to grow up. The Book of James was written to Christian Jews who had major problems in the church, a serious problem with the tongue, and the problem of worldliness. These are some of the same problems that I face today. To become the saint that pleases God, I need to move from spiritual immaturity to spiritual maturing; hence, no longer a babe in Christ.

Dr. Wiersbe stated that, when I grow up, my spiritual maturity will look like the following: I will be patient in testing; I will practice the truth; I will have power over my tongue; I will be a peacemaker, not a troublemaker; and I will be prayerful in troubles.

Be Mature has given me the basic knowledge that, no matter what the trials may be on the outside or the temptations on the inside, through faith in Christ, I can experience victory. How I face my trials is evaluated in the light of what God is doing for me. God has used Dr. Wiersbe to show me that trials help to produce patience, endurance, and the ability to keep persevering when times are rough is a learning state that is difficult for me. As I grow up, I must look at trials as God's means to mature me.

Be Mature explains how I should handle temptations. Temptations appeal to my natural desires which will lead to sorrows and punishments that were initially hidden. The Word of God is the key to saying "no" to times of temptation. The goodness of God is the greatest barrier against me yielding to temptation. God's goodness is much better than Satan's bargains. As with trials, the purpose of any temptation is to teach me patience.

Be Mature has allowed me to take a look at my relationship with God and view just where I am in my spiritual growth. Maturing in Christ is a process that needs God's help. I am truly getting this help from the Word of God.God has clearly used Dr. Wiersbe to refocus my attention to attain spiritual maturity. A systematic study of the

Book of James has enlightened me to what I need to look like in the eyesight of God and those that I come in contact with on a daily basis. The time spent in studying the Book of James, as taught by Dr. Warren W. Wiersbe, has been an experience for me that I am truly thankful. This study comes at a time when I am experiencing trials at work, in church ministries, and within myself.

I've been hesitant to study the Book of James because I've never wanted to hear about the most dangerous weapon that I possess--the tongue. Dr. Wiersbe's teaching method eased my anxiety and showed me what damage I inflict by the improper use of the tongue.

Systematically teaching how to learn to be patient, how to overcome temptation, how to practice what the Bible teaches, how to learn to control the tongue, how to make peace rather than trouble, and how to pray and get results is convicting me to look in the mirror to see if I see spiritual growth and maturity or the old nature. If I am seeing the old nature, it needs to be put to death.

How can you keep your faith in college? Many people call it "the best years of your life"- no parents, no curfew, no authority - basically no rules. College is four years of football games, fraternity parties, late nights leading to hangovers, and maybe some Statistics homework, in case your parents ask.

Pretty much everything who you are and who you will be is up for grabs. And, for the first time, you're in charge! But what many say are the best years, the church often calls the worst. Research says anywhere from 75 to 90 percent of high school seniors who call themselves Christians will abandon their faith by college graduation.

That's devastating, but it

also makes sense. One invites you to Communion, the other to a game of kings. Jesus says, "I am the Truth," (John 14:6), while college says truth is personal and subjective, if anything at all. College will hold things you've never imagined. You will hear more "isms" (pluralism, Satanism, individualism) than you knew existed and face more addictions (drug, alcohol, porn, eating disorders) than you thought possible.

In order to overcome temptation and stay close to the Lord, we must be "transformed by the renewing of *our* mind" (Romans 12:2). There is no other weapon against temptation except the "sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God" (Ephesians 6:17). Colossians 3:2 says,

"Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on earth." If our minds are overflowing with the latest TV shows, music, and everything else this culture has to offer, we will be bombarded with messages and images that inevitably lead to sinful lusts. But if our minds are filled with the holiness of God, the love of Christ, and the brilliance of both reflected in His perfect Word, we will find that our interest in the lusts of the world lessen. But without the Word's influence on our minds, we are open to anything Satan wants to throw at us. Resist the devil and he shall flee!


