The Lord God of all Creation has graciously endowed us with a complex brain that controls our thoughts, memory, speech, movement of our limbs, and the function of all the organs within our body. He has masterfully designed

and blessed us with an extraordinary brain that is made up of over 100 billion neurons, interconnected cells, chemical neurotransmitters and blood vessels. Our brain houses our mind, which gives us the specific capacity to learn, store, retrieve, and remember enormous amounts of information and experiences.

The mind is also responsible for thinking, thoughts, emotions, feelings, attitude, beliefs, imagination, perception, reason, and of course memory. Unfortunately, occurrences like brain infections, head injuries medical and psychological disorders can cause temporary or permanent memory loss. Negative life experiences, stress, anxiety, depression and emotional trauma can affect our retention of information and our Relevant past experiences can be forgotten or erased from our mind. In some cases, this amnesia or loss of memory can be a choice.

Similarly, during our Christian life, we can suffer spiritual amnesia. This type of memory loss erases or dismisses the remembrance of the Lord's goodness and blessings upon our lives. Forgetfulness can be brought on by sin, disobedience, and a harden heart, along with the hardships of life. To complicate matters, Satan tries to invade our mind through persuasion to weaken our faith and trust in our Savior, Jesus Christ. The Adversary wants us to believe that our God will desert us, not be with us, or help us the next time a hardship comes our way. Instead, we should always

remember that Jesus Christ promises never to leave or forsake us (Hebrews 13:5). Also, according to James 1:17, God does not change like shifting shadows.

The Lord's inexhaustible blessings are infinite, and His mercies are new every morning (Lamentations 3:22-23).

The Bible makes it crystal clear that our remembrance of God's promises, commandments, precepts, statues, and principles are a very significant part of our faith walk. The Bible also mentions over 300 times the concept of remembering, having remembrance of, not forgetting, and being mindful of God's power, faithfulness, and instructions. In the archives of our mind, we should have a catalog of God's blessings for quick recall, such as past healing from illnesses, miraculous return from financial ruin, protection from enemies and oppressors. We should also remember His stilling the storms of our lives, miraculous rescues from devastation, and narrow escapes from hurt, harm, and danger—the list can go on and on.

Just like the people of God at Horeb, the Lord wants us to remember the miracles He has performed in our lives and to share them with our children. Deuteronomy 4:9 states, Only be careful, and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget the things your eyes have seen or let them fade from your heart as long as you live. Teach them to your children and to their children after them." The Lord has told us, showed us, and kept His word over and over again. The Bible instructs us in Psalm 103:2, Praise the Lord, my soul, and forget not all His benefits.

The sin of forgetfulness occurs several times in the Bible. The people of Israel were a very forgetful people; they murmured and complained each time a new hardship came into their life. 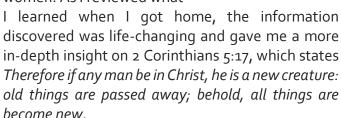
