Message from the First Lady

We love to have celebrations: birthday parties, housewarmings, baby showers, etc., but probably the most notable celebration in anyone's life is their wedding reception! This is a time when individuals come together to celebrate the divine union of a man and a woman.

According to John 2, there is a wedding celebration. The bride and bridegroom are in the midst of a marriage celebration when Jesus performs His first miracle. In reading, I noticed that verse 2 says Jesus was invited (NIV). For Jesus to be in the place to perform the miracle, He had to be invited first. Imagine if Jesus was not on the guest list in Cana. Who would Mary have turned to when the wine ran out halfway through the celebration (v. 3)? Who would have given the servants instructions (vv. 5-7)? But most importantly, who would have been able to turn the mere water into the best wine ever tasted (vv. 9-10)? The couple knew enough to invite Jesus, but it was the disciples who received the ultimate gift – they believed in Him (v. 11)!



Much like our salvation, Jesus is available to us, but we *must* invite Him in. Once we invite Him, then He can perform the miracle of *saving our souls*! Is Jesus on your Guest List? Have you invited Him into your heart? If not, you can do that today by saying the following prayer:

Lord, I know that I am a sinner. But I believe you died for my sins and rose from the dead. Therefore, I now invite you into my heart as my personal Lord and Savior. In the name of Jesus, I pray with thanksgiving. Amen.

If you prayed and believe this prayer, as it says in Romans 10:9-13, **you are now Saved!** Your life is in Jesus' Hands, and your soul is secured for eternity – certainly an event worth celebrating. **Welcome to the family!**
